God's conditional promise, not a magic verse.

If you were to do a street survey and ask what verses in the Bible protect us, someone would likely list 1 Corinthians 10:13, not likely by Book. Chapter and Verse but by a scattered misapplication of the verse.

This Corinthian letter is written to those of the church of God. sanctified in Christ lesus, called to be saints. This means the contents of this letter are for Christians. These people had obeved the Gospel and put on Christ by a burial in baptism (Romans 6:4, Galatians 3:27) to walk in newness of life.

If we, as modern-day Christians, also faithfully follow what written in God's word for us, then we too can reap the benefits of the faith.

The verse states," God is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will also make the way of escape. that you may be able to bear it." In a chapter that encourages to flee from idolatry, Christians only are given the promise of this verse. The book is written to Christians, not they cannot suffer to non-Christians.

To reinforce this promise, the early part of the verse gives the Corinthian Christians an example that "No temptation has overtaken vou except such as is common to man."

These faithful Christians NEVER had a temptation without a way of escape. because God will not allow vou...Christian to suffer with temptation you cannot bear.

Hev Christian! Yes, vou're going to have common temptation to come your way! Flee it!

Hev non-Christian! Yes, vou're going to have some overwhelming temptation to come your wav...What are you going to do about it?

The person on the street is often deceived that overwhelming temptation. Satan is the father of lies.

With out a plan, there is no attack, without attack, there is no victory. Victory is only in lesus because he gave us a plan of salvation. If vou're not a Christian. what is your plan to overcome temptation?

Greater Than Family & Driver (Mark 1:16-20, Pt. 3)

At the risk of overgeneralizing, there are two major kinds of cultures one may identify. A traditional culture is one that esteems family above everything else. A "modern" culture is one that esteems personal wealth and success. Countries may tend towards one of these tendencies, but a culture, states, cities, and families will have their unique emphasis.

Mark 1:19-20 says, "19 And going on a little farther, he saw James the son of Zebedee and John his brother, who were in their boat mending the nets. 20 And immediately he called them, and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired servants and followed him." Imagine James and John fixing their nets, looking up to see Jesus approaching, and then

dropping what they were doing to follow. I don't imagine they even finished working on the nets!

There are two things from which James and John walk away. The first thing we will mention is the last thing in the text... "the hired servants." These brothers walked away from hired servants. Being a fisherman is not the most lucrative job in the world, but to have a fishing operation that has hired servants means you are doing well.

In this culture, it would be expected for the sons to carry on this business, but here they are walking away from it all. These guys have come to understand that Jesus is more significant than a comfortable financial future. It is not inherently wrong to be well off, but would you pursue this to the

neglect of following the Lord?

The first thing in the text they walk away from is "their father Zebedee." This is even more shocking than leaving the hired servants. We are not given any details on whether this decision brought family tension and strife. Perhaps there was some collateral damage like this, but these brothers were unconcerned about these matters. Does Jesus mean more to you than family? You could test this is whether you change your views to fit family members or attend family gatherings when they interfere with worship. When we are concerned with "what would they think" we are not seeing the opportunity we must follow Jesus.

Jesus is greater than the values of both traditional and modern cultures. How does this challenge you?
